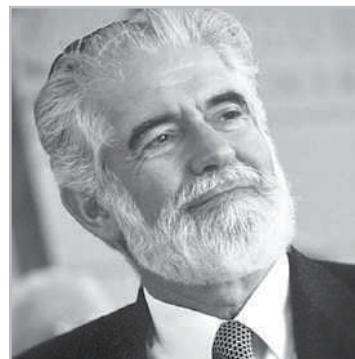

ANNUAL REVIEW INTRODUCTION

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2019 marks 25 years Afrika Tikkun has been effecting change. Over this period, we experienced an incredible transformation; from offering basic assistance to victims of floods, fire, hunger and disease, to establishing five centres of excellence that implement programmes impacting an average of 12 000 young lives every year. Our vision is to enable the economic empowerment of young people in South Africa by tackling the socio-economic drivers that make it difficult for them to break away from the cycle of poverty. Our vehicle for doing is our Cradle to Career 360° model - an approach that supports the educational, personal development, career development, nutrition, health and skills development of young individuals. This, we believe, leads to various types of work opportunities and eventually the reduction of youth unemployment in the country.

Our five community-based centres not only reach thousands of young people but the broader community as a whole. To date, we are proud to have created employment and developed the competencies of at least 400 individuals each year (and indirectly a further 2,000 family members) within the local communities where we operate.

We invite you to review our 2019 Annual Review which chronicles progress and challenges in our efforts to help change the life of young people in South Africa. This incredible experience would have never happened without support from you and all our partners, stakeholders and supporters. 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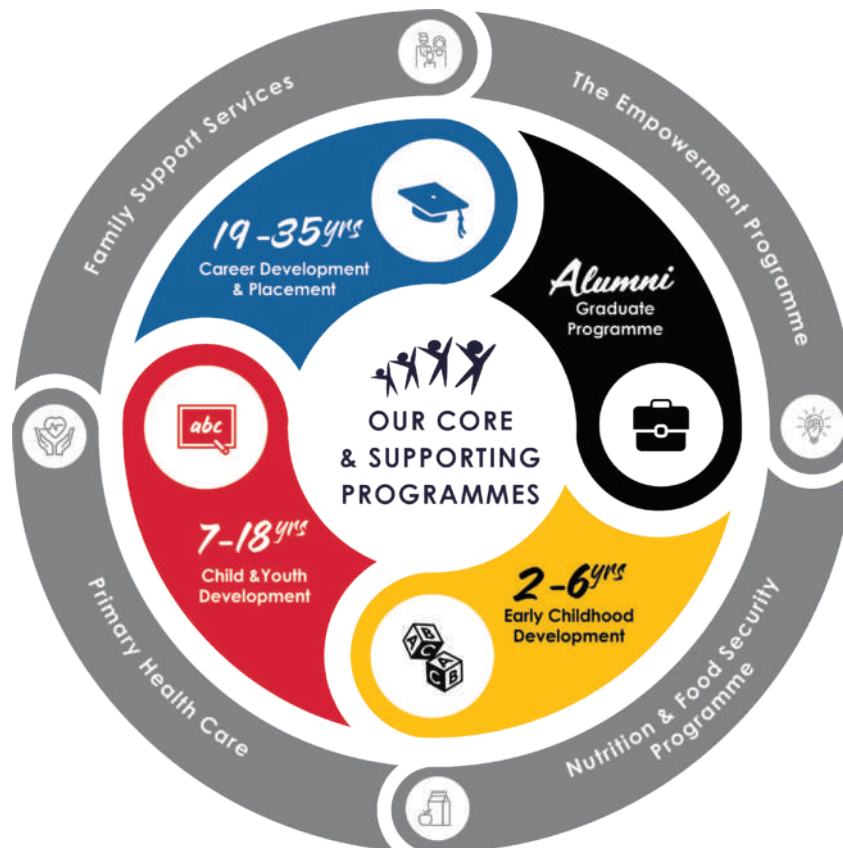
WHY WE EXIST

Afrika Tikkun exists to reduce youth unemployment and child poverty in South Africa by tackling the socio-economic drivers that make it difficult for young people to access the economy as productive citizens. We achieve this by providing comprehensive services that enable a young person to progress through every stage of their development until they emerge an educated, value-based, career-driven and employable adult. This is essentially our Cradle to Career 360° model. Through our specialised/vocational skills development and career placement programmes, young people are further supported to achieve the ultimate goal of progressing into employment or self-employment.



360° CRADLE TO CAREER MODEL

Our 360° Social Support Services (SSS) programme focuses on the specific developmental and age-appropriate needs of children and young people aged 2-35 years. These services are divided into core and support programmes:



CORE PROGRAMMES



Early Childhood Development (ECD):

Targeted at children aged 2-6 years, this programme focuses on the achievement of age appropriate developmental and school readiness milestones to set a firm foundation for learning throughout the school career.



Child & Youth Development (CYD):

An after-school programme for children aged 7-18 years that provides a series of activities for education, leadership, career and personal development throughout their formative years while in the schooling system.



Career Development Programme (CDP):

Provides career guidance, job readiness training, industry specific specialised training (Retail, Hospitality, and ICT), job placement (entry level jobs, learnerships and work experience opportunities) and bursaries for further learning. These activities enable young people aged 19-35 to access economic opportunities after finishing high school.

360° SOCIAL SUPPORT SERVICES



OUR VALUES

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Afrika Tikkun aims to have a positive impact on the broader community as a whole. Approximately 85% of our employees are from the communities surrounding the centres, which contributes to sustainable household income. This makes us one of the largest formal employers in our targeted Gauteng communities of Orange Farm, Alexandra, Diepsloot and Braamfontein, and Mfuleni in the Western Cape. We believe the biggest beneficiary of economically empowered youth is the economy itself. The more engaged, educated and employable a population, the less prevalent are unemployment and crime.

UNITED KINGDOM PARTNERS

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2019 was one of the most successful years for Afrika Tikkun UK in regards to making an impact on the young people within the Afrika Tikkun South Africa family.

The year saw us supporting more programmes than ever before - over and above the core programs - and contributing over ZAR 30m.

A few examples of the programmes we supported include:

- The Cradle to Career core programmes funded by the Belron Group
- Establishing IT centres in all 5 centres (made possible through a donation from The Lubner Family in honour of Ronnie and Rhona Lubner)
- Garden-2-Kindergarten across all centres (supported by Nedbank South African Charity Golf Day (NSACG); Ride for Change & Stonehage Fleming; Belron)
- Learning Libraries (supported by Stonehage Fleming and The Holder family)
- Empowerment and disabilities programme (supported by St James Foundation)
- Water purification and boreholes (supported by Belron)
- Security upgrade (supported by Belron)

In addition to the above programmes, the Belron World Conference took place in Cape Town in February and saw approximately 150 global team leaders from Belron attend A Day at The Mfuleni Centre. This was a resounding

success and a brilliant team event where participants from Belron worked with Afrika Tikkun in various activities, including bicycle building, erecting grow tunnels and the planting of trees, veggies and fruit. On the day, Belron donated a fully kitted container to store and maintain the bicycles. We are extremely grateful to Belron for taking an entire day out of their conference schedule to make such an enormous and long-lasting contribution to Afrika Tikkun Mfuleni Centre.

The Spirit of Belron Challenge (SOBC) was once again the highlight of our year. The theme of the event was 25 for 25 with the aim to raise ZAR 25m to celebrate 25 years of Afrika Tikkun. Over 2,100 people from around the world came together to celebrate, raise funds and support Afrika Tikkun. The event saw people gather and take part in all the activities on offer while the young adults representing Afrika Tikkun from South Africa were clearly overwhelmed at the support and team spirit displayed by the entire Belron family. In the end, the target was achieved! We extend our sincere gratitude to Belron for their ongoing and unwavering support.

2019 was also an inspiring year for our Emerging Leaders Board (ELB), with Sam Lubner as chairman. Many of the ELB participated in SOBC, helped at the NSACGD and undertook a number of initiatives to raise funds. We are grateful for their ongoing support and continue to enjoy working with the ELB.

We would like to thank Carole Day and Jennifer Miles of the UK team for their dedication and hard work. The end of 2019 also saw the departure of Jennifer Miles; we thank her for her amazing contribution and support over the years at Afrika Tikkun and wish her the best. We welcome Claire Mc Donald into the role of Admin and Grants co-ordinator.

Finally a massive Thank You to the board of Afrika Tikkun UK for their invaluable contribution and support. We look forward to a fantastic 2020 and to ensuring that our contribution and impact on the lives of those in South Africa is even more meaningful and supportive than ever before.

We continued to see strong resonance for our campaign theme of “Today’s Youth, Tomorrow’s Leaders”. This theme draws awareness to our collective responsibility to invest in our children’s future by ensuring that its leaders are well-educated, socially and fiscally responsible, ethical, community-conscious, global citizens. Beneath this umbrella theme, we’ve seen great support for Afrika Tikkun’s unique platform, purposefully designed to not only nourish the talent and hopes of our 12,000 young people, but to provide them with tangible economic opportunities from which to emerge as leaders.

Building on our strategy to expand awareness of Afrika Tikkun within the USA, we extended our intimate Salons to more cities in 2019, leveraging this setting to meet and engage our growing network of supporters and partners. As a validating outcome of our first Philadelphia Salon in 2016 (where we had 35 attendees), we hosted a tremendously successful Legacy Celebration in honour of Steve Collis in Philadelphia in April 2019, attended by over 170 local supporters.

All in all, we are proud to report that 2019 was our largest fundraising year to date.

The June and Eliot Tatelman Camps in South Africa, held each year in June and December, continue to expand our mission to empower our young people to tackle the HIV/AIDS pandemic. These camps have become a core feature

of the Afrika Tikkun curriculum, creating a positive ripple effect through our community centres. They enable our young people to build confidence and hope, to learn vital life-skills, to build peer based support groups, and to gain gender and violence-related advocacy capabilities that bolster their communities.

Our Junior Board, with Benjamin Jacobson at the helm as Chairman, has continued to thrive, expanding the number of new participants via our high-school club programmes, as well as seeing a growing number of young adults renewing their commitment to Afrika Tikkun. We are also thrilled to have brought on Eizabeth Whitney Rubel as Executive Director in our New York office. Elizabeth brings

with her a breadth of international experience and expertise to her role in spearheading our New York office.

We'd like to thank our Board of Directors, generous donors, vendors and advisors for their continued support in helping bring awareness and vital funds to Afrika Tikkun's mission, empowering tens of thousands of the most vulnerable young people in the disadvantaged communities of South Africa to become the leaders of tomorrow.

We look forward to continuing our great work in 2020.

KEY PROJECTS

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ReGreening project

In September 2019, Afrika Tikkun's Wings of Life Diepsloot centre and PlantNation led a greening programme with a group of young people eager to incorporate environmental protection and sustainable solutions into youth development. The teams discussed the importance of farming and planting, including the contribution trees make to air quality and clean climate, and also learned how to start and maintain a garden. The initiative led to the planting of 80 new trees which now beautify the centre. This action of planting trees, impactful at local level, is also in line with a larger, global movement to plant billions of trees worldwide in order to revert deforestation. "We are seeding the revolution one tree at a time," said David Jaffe of PlantNation, an organisation that educates people to not only earn a living but grow one too.

These trees are just the beginning for a broader movement towards a greener South Africa, and there are plans to plant more trees at our other centres.

Events and campaigns

Spelling Bee

Every October, after months of preparation and spelling practice, young people from all 5 centres take part in the Spelling Bee Final. Four extremely worthy winners, representing each of the four age categories, take home the title of Spelling Bee Champions. Among other benefits,

the event serves to inspire learning and improve literacy. In addition, the Spelling Bee encourages the development of a range of cognitive proficiencies, including the ability to handle pressure, public speaking capabilities and knowledge retention. Beyond this, it develops self-confidence and aids young people in learning concepts and life skills.



Talent Day

Every July, Afrika Tikkun hosts Talent Day, an annual sports, arts and culture competition which brings together over 3,500 young people from our community centres. It's a day where we celebrate our young people and their talents, encourage integration, and establish a platform for personal interaction and community engagement. Talent Day offers the chance for youth to enhance their physical and social skills.

The various activities and training conducted in preparation for the event and the event itself inculcates human values such as respect for the opponent, acceptance of binding rules, teamwork and fairness, all of which are principles contained in the Charter of the United Nations. Most importantly for us, events such as Talent Day bring together disparate people by strengthening ties and celebrating the common ideals of fairness, sacrifice and hope. And lastly, it's an unbelievably fun and enjoyable day!

Gala Dinner

The Second Annual Gala Dinner was an inspiring, fun-filled evening, celebrating the prominent South Africans who have changed the game in their industry. It also served as a reminder of our many achievements over the last



25 years. This year we were honoured to host incredible guests while being entertained by talented MCs and hosts. The evening's auctions raised monies that will allow us to continue our programmes that empower young people.



Quiz & Debate

This year, Afrika Tikkun held its inaugural Quiz and Debate competition which brought to life the subjects of history, geography, world events and current affairs. It provided young people with the opportunity to develop their critical and creative thinking, information literacy skills and problem-solving abilities. It presented an opportunity to work within a team and to offer logical arguments in a convincing manner. This is a skill set that stays with young people into adulthood. Quiz and Debate aids young people in learning concepts and life skills, and encourages them to interact with fellow participants and cultivate friendships. Afrika Tikkun would like to thank our sponsors and partner Rookie USA ZA. Their involvement in 2019 includes

sponsoring prizes as well as a monetary donation of R50,000, meeting their target of a R1,000 donation per social media post by a well-known South African influencer. Rookie USA Brand and Marketing Manager, Lee-Anne McKenzie says, "We are privileged to have been a part of Afrika Tikkun's initiatives. There is no better feeling than impacting young people's lives in a profound way. We hope that this is the start of a prosperous relationship between Rookie USA and Afrika Tikkun, it makes us smile to see the new friendships established with the kids".

GOVERNANCE OVERVIEW

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The board of Afrika Tikkun NPC (“Afrika Tikkun”) is committed to effective and ethical leadership through the adoption and implementation of principles of good governance. This is not limited to board and management level, but evident throughout the operations of the organisation.

The board is the focal point of and custodian of ethics and corporate governance. In line with the recommendations of the King Code on Corporate Governance for South Africa 2016 (“King IV”), Afrika Tikkun has adopted a proportional approach to corporate governance, adopting and implementing those principles which are appropriate to the size, complexity and resources of Afrika Tikkun.

The board consists of both executive and non-executive directors, the majority of whom are independent. The Chair of the board is an independent, non-executive director and the Chief Executive Officer is an ex officio member of the board. Directors are drawn from diverse backgrounds, providing a variety of viewpoints, range of knowledge, skills and experience. In the past year, Afrika Tikkun has increased the size of its board by the appointment of three young Black female directors, which substantially improves the gender, race and age balance on the board. The board now consists of five females (four Black and one White) and four White males. Half the board is under 60 years of age. Directors serve in an entirely voluntary capacity, giving of their time and wisdom

without any financial remuneration. Their satisfaction comes with the knowledge that they are contributing to uplifting the lives of young people.

The board meets four times a year to review reports on the performance of Afrika Tikkun against the organisation’s vision, strategy and budgets. Senior management regularly attend board meetings to report on the activities of Afrika Tikkun.

The board has a well-established Audit and Risk Committee and a Human Capital Committee to assist with fulfilling its obligations. The Audit and Risk Committee meets at least three times each year to review the financial performance of Afrika Tikkun and oversee management of risk. Managing risk is the responsibility of all managers within Afrika Tikkun.

The Human Capital Committee assists the board on matters relating to Afrika Tikkun’s employees and meets as and when necessary, but at least twice a year. Alef Meulenberg was appointed as Deputy Chief Executive Officer in 2019.

BDO South Africa Incorporated (“BDO”) was re-appointed as auditors of Afrika Tikkun at the Annual General Meeting of Members held in June 2019. Kathryn Luck remains the designated auditor of Afrika Tikkun.

BDO attends meetings of the Audit and Risk Committee by invitation when the financial statements or the annual audit of Afrika Tikkun are under consideration. BDO regularly meets with the audit and risk committee without management present. In line with international best

practice, the committees have recently adopted formal terms of reference. In line with the recommendations of King, the independence of long-standing directors would be reviewed in the forthcoming year. The Chair is investigating the introduction of a formal board assessment in 2020.

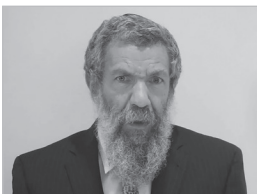

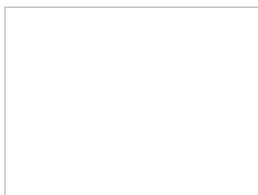
